


1 Fitting the Stand


The TV panel must be facing downwards.

For the stand installation, there is one type of screw provided as shown below.

Used for attaching the stand to the TV set (fig.2)






Wall Mounting the TV

The TV is equipped with a single control button located at the bottom of the LED light.



TV Control Button

Short press TV control button to open the Inputs menu.

Close: Exit the Input menu.


Turn off TV: Turn the TV to standby mode. Blu-ray Player: Access the external device connected

through HDMI or AV terminal.

Live TV: Access the Live TV mode. Home: Access the Home screen



2 Connecting your Set




Connect the TV to your power socket.

To use Freely to receive free channels and on-demand shows, connect the TV to the internet. You can do this by connecting to Wi-Fi during the first time installation setup or by plugging in an Ethernet cable from your router to the TV.




If you choose to, you can top up your channels with an aerial connection. Connect the RF input from the TV to your outdoor Digital TV aerial.

3 Powering On the TV




Switch on the television by pressing the on/ off button on the bottom of the LED light.



Insert the batteries supplied into the remote control and press the standby button to power on the TV.

4 Set up your Roku TV

1. Introduction & Language



When the set first turns on, it enters the First Time Installation mode. The First Time Installation normally runs only once, the first time you turn on your TV. If you need to run it again, you must perform a factory reset by navigating to **Settings** > **System** > **Ad**vanced system settings > Factory reset, and then highlighting Factory reset everything.

Select your preferred on-screen display language. This will change the language in which the menus and associated information is displayed in.

2. Country Selection



If you see this screen, select your country, and then

3. TV Mode



Press OK to select **Set up for home use**. This is the right choice for enjoying your TV at home. It provides energy saving options as well as access to all features

Note: Set up for shop use configures the TV for retail display and is not recommended for any

4. Network Setup



You can connect the TV to your broadband router or wireless network in order to take advantage of the Smart functions. If you connect the TV to your router using an Ethernet cable, the Wi-Fi set up will be skipped.

5. Wireless Network Setup



If you selected option Wireless in previous step, the TV scans for the wireless networks within range and displays them. Select your network by using up/down arrows and confirm with OK.

6. Entering Wi-Fi password



If your wireless network is password protected, an on-screen keyboard appears. Enter your wireless network password by using the purple directional pad. When you finish, press the down arrow to select Connect, and then press OK.

7. Activation

After the TV restarts, it prompts you through activation


Use a computer, tablet or mobile phone with an Internet connection to link to a new or existing Roku account.

You need a Roku account to activate your Roku TV and access entertainment across thousands of streaming channels.

Note: Roku does not charge for activation support, beware of scams. Roku accounts are free. Providing your credit card ing and subscribing to entertainment from the Roku Channel Store fast and convenient. If you aren't ready to connect your TV to a network, you can still use it as regular TV.

8. Connect your devices




Connect all the devices you plan to use with your TV (such as Blu-ray™ player or game console), turn them all on, and then select Everything is plugged in and turned on. The TV now takes you step by step through each of its inputs and asks what kind of device you have connected.



Press arrow keys to highlight the label you want to associate with the input, and then press OK. If you are not using the input, select **Nothing**, and the input won't appear on the Home screen.





Setting up the TV Tuner

- **1.** Make sure that your aerial (not provided) is connected to the TV's RF IN input.
- 2. On the Home screen, select the Live TV input. If it is not on your Home screen, go to Settings > TV Inputs to add it.
- 3. Read the simple on-screen instructions, and then select Start finding channels.
- 4. If prompted, select your time zone. You'll only need to do this if the TV can't figure out your time zone from your Internet connection.
